Daniel 12:1-3 / 158


In those days, I Daniel,



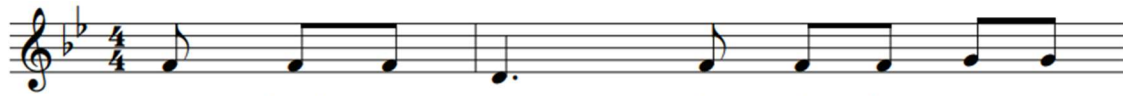

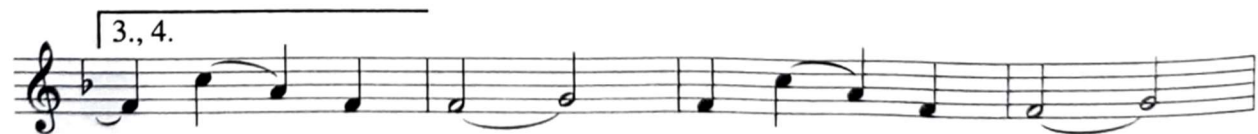
