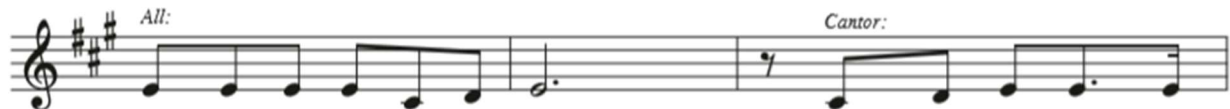




Zechariah 9:9-10 / 100

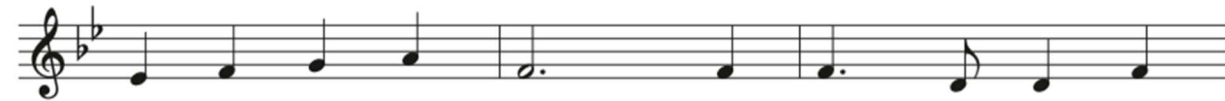

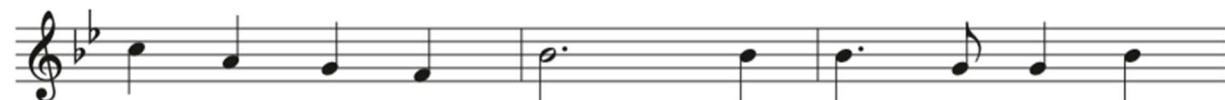
